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Foreword

18% of the population in South Asia are young people in the age group of 15- 24 years. These young people represent a demographic dividend with high aspirations and potential. Declarations such as the 2013 Global Thematic Consultation on Population Dynamics formally recognise that constructive and accountable leadership of young people in the future, including their active participation in economic, political and social life is only possible when governments and civil society invest in education and healthcare.

The specific initiatives that these investments should include are comprehensive sexuality education (life skills education) and access to sexual and reproductive health care, including family planning. These are very important considering illiteracy, forced child marriage and gender based violence that place young people in South Asia at very high risk of unintended pregnancies, complications resulting from unsafe abortions and violence. Equally important is that this change be led by young people, especially young people from marginalised communities and young women.

Through desk based reviews, interviews with key informants from local organisations and online surveys, this mapping report lists youth -led and youth- serving organisations, commonalities of programme portfolios and knowledge products that are mutually beneficial.

Previous mapping initiatives covered working groups, international NGOs, youth-friendly SRH services, faith based youth networks and SRHR thematic youth networks, culminating in recommendations for creating a youth networking strategy.

This mapping report broadly classifies and details the types and modes of youth programming. Specifically, classification based on the nature of interaction with young people and the primary model of programming as being either service delivery oriented and/or advocacy. It also includes a directory of innovative initiatives across South Asia, importantly, highlighting the potential and aspirations of organisations to transition from being youth serving to youth led.

The current mapping study has not only identified organisations/networks/individuals with programme portfolios that focus on young people but uniquely classify them based on the nature of their interaction with young people. This work can be classified as organisations (programmes) that work 'for' youth wherein the programmes are decided, designed and developed by adults; working 'through' youth wherein programmes assign young people a pre-decided role to reach a specific objective and working 'with' youth equally.

Organisations are further classified based on their work. Specifically, as being distinctly service delivery focused (youth friendly sexual and reproductive health services) or distinctly human rights focused with programming relating to identity, sexuality, bodily autonomy, consent, choice etc.

This report considers the direct and tangential programming that encompasses SRH work. Organisations directly working on SRH themes with specific departments for youth programming and engagement as well as those working on broader areas such as women's organisations, livelihoods and primary education with the potential to introduce young people to their programme portfolio are both included towards identifying collaborative opportunities between the two.

We hope the findings of the report and the directory of organisations will encourage our peers to partner with young people and provide clarity for measuring youth leadership. Importantly, we hope that it acknowledges the potential of young people and our collective inter-generational capacities to bring about change.

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About the Document

This document, a result of a mapping study undertaken in nine countries in south Asia, showcases the dynamism of youth work and SRHR work in the region. It contains a purposive sample of 68 organisations/ networks working either on issues of SRHR, youth development and participation or both, with full recognition that the two are intrinsically linked.

The data presented in the directory is information gathered either through primary data shared by the respective organisations/networks and/or supported by desk research. This is by no means an exhaustive list.

By its very nature, a 'map' highlights the contour of a terrain to give a picture. With this understanding, and given that the study was aimed at strengthening SRHR work with/for youth in South Asia, the choice of listing an organization in this document has been exercised based on the following:

- Only those organisations that are working with youth, either as primary audience or as one of the key target audiences have been included.
- Organisations where evidence of innovative approaches and methodologies have been found, have been included.
- Youth-led organisations have been given priority, and have been included to the maximum extent possible.
- Diversity in terms of size, outreach, scope and nature of work has been given priority in an effort to capture the dynamism of the work happening in the region. This also implies that similar organisations may not have been listed. This does not discount the quality or the relevance of the work they do.
- Availability of information about an organization has also determined its inclusion in the study.

The purposive sample maps the following for each of the organisations listed:

- A categorization based on their focus on youth and SRHR as well as youth leadership.
- Engagement of the organization/network in sectoral capacity building.
- A brief description of the organisation and its work.
- A snapshot of relevant approaches and methodologies they use while working with young people and/or on SRHR.
- Contact details including address, phone numbers, website, email, Facebook and YouTube links.
- A list of resources including publications, trainings, research, films etc.

It is hoped that this directory will contribute towards strengthening collaboration and networking among organisations working on SRHR of young people in the region by acting as an Information guide/ready reference material and support them to transcend geographical boundaries.

Mittika developed and implemented YCS to initiate the implementation of VSO India's 5 year youth strategy. ABC or 'Ab, Baaki Charcha' or 'Now, the Remaining Dialogue' is an advocacy campaign, which used magic, dance and movements, forum theater and games and arts to engage Delhi's citizens, especially young men in dialogue for gender justice. The campaign could engage over 6000 people in 34 communities in Delhi-NCR in dialog in three months. In its second avatar, the campaign focused on building dialogue on masculinities through theater and spurring youth-led action and succeeded in forming action groups in 7 Delhi colleges. ABC is a collaboration between CHSJ (MenEngage Secretariat in South Asia) and Mittika.

Two new and emerging strategies of the organization are research and advocacy. Rozan was the Secretariat of the MenEngage Alliance until 2011 and conducts research on masculinities as well as works with men and boys in the community to mobilize them against VAW.

Rozan, being the first helpline to work on SRH related issues with youth in Pakistan, is recognized as resource center for other helplines.

Humqadam, an Urdu word meaning 'a companion who walks alongside,' is programme of Rozan that aims at creating spaces for men to engage with the issue of violence against women. Humqadam explores alternative and healthier models of masculinities, raises awareness and mobilizes young men and boys at the community level to take the responsibility of addressing gender based violence at personal and community levels. In addition to running group education sessions, the programme offers young men and boys opportunities for activism through theatre training and campaigns.

Using its approved training curriculum 'Attitudinal Change Module,' Rozan works with in-training Cadres, Constables, Sub-Inspectors, Inspectors as well as Assistant Superintendents of Police in Police Training Schools/Colleges across Pakistan to build their capacity and ownership to deal with issue of violence against women and children.

Its programmes provide leadership education through a service learning model, empowering young people to solve social issues. Blue Ribbon Movement was founded in 2000, by a group of young people passionate about the country. Its founding principle was 'Together We are Stronger.'	NSS Community Connect Fellowship (NSS CCF) is a 6-month fellowship to build young civic leaders to solve city level problems through service learning. In partnership with National Service Scheme, Praja and Mumbai First, the programme aims to develop leadership skills, active citizenship and employability amongst youth. In 2014, NSS CCF was voted as the second best initiative globally at the Democracy Innovation Award, France. The Blue Ribbon Movement had organised Mumbai+20 as a simulation of the United Nations Earth Summit that was held in Rio in June 2012. It was a project aimed at mobilize youth, educate them on the urgency of Sustainable Development issues and encourage them to involve themselves in the negotiation process, albeit from a distance. Relead is a week-long international program for high-potential young leaders under 35 who seek to understand and impact the world by building skills and perspectives to lead into the future. Relead brings together the latest and most relevant training and individuals to build this capacity in young people. Through a combination of speakers, workshops, simulations, reflection, art and theatre, discussions and on-field projects, participants re-examine what leadership means to them and develop their own philosophy and way of leading.

IGNITE! is a programme of YVC, which was started for young MSM and young transgender women in Asia-Pacific to build a cradle of young leaders for the HIV movement in Asia and the Pacific. IGNITE! is designed as a peer-led 2 year programme that offers strong capacity building opportunities and mentorship support to each participant as well as a seed support for implementing two small scale projects in their own countries. A dedicated mentor supports the learning process of each participant, who helps them to develop work plans for the projects, guides them in the implementation process and creates opportunities for their exposure and networking.
